Former Chevrolet GM Jim Perkins has passed away. He played a large part in saving the Corvette from cancellation during his tenure. He accomplished much more than that but he will be remembered as a friend and supporter of the National Corvette Museum and a most deserving member of the Corvette Hall of Fame.

The Museum admissions and 'Gateway' areas are undergoing a remodel and it is expected to be completed by the end of March.





Road Trip



Pat Hillyard has planned a trip for the Club to take place September 15th to the 18th or 19th, 2019. It is mainly a driving trip that will cover some routes with great Corvette roads. The trip will start out from Uniontown Mall In Pennsylvania and travel through Elkins, West Virginia to Harrisonville, Virginia, and from there get on the Blue Ridge Parkway. There will be a stop for dinner at the Liberty Station Restaurant in Bedford, Virginia, and will spend that first night in Roanoke, Virginia. The next morning the drive will continue on the Blue Ridge Parkway and then on to Asheville, North Carolina, spending the second night there. The next

morning there will be a tour of the Biltmore Estate and then head on to Blairsville, Georgia and dinner will be at a motorcy-cle/sports car resort and spend the night in that area. The next morning will start with a drive on the Gauntlet, a loop of 133 miles of twisty roads through the mountains of northeast Georgia. From there the drive will continue to Tellico Plains, Tennessee to drive the Cherahola Skyway to Robbinsville, North Carolina and then on to Deals Gap to drive the Tail of the Dragon. From there the route will go to the Foothills Parkway to head to Pigeon Forge. In Pigeon Forge there will be some options depending on how long we stay and could include a visit to Dollywood and/or the Titanic and the Floyd Garrett Muscle Car Museum. The drive home will be on the Super Slabs.

From Autoweek, here are some photos of the midengine Corvette, aka C8, in near production form presented in what is described as the best view yet, even though it is still camouflaged. There are also some known facts. The next Corvette will probably get a more powerful version of the current 6.2 liter LT1 V8. There might also be turbo charging and more power than the current ZR1's 750 hp. It will have a dual clutch transmission, but it's not known if that will be optional along with a manual transmission. There should also be more lightweight materials like aluminum, carbon fiber and fiberglass. The thought is that GM's MagneRide will make an appearance and it would be world-beater fast.

In the photos you can see the cab forward design of the mid-engine Vette and now there are large air scoops to cool whatever power components go back there. There are also new vents in front to cool oil or transmission fluid. The headlights are not well defined yet but part of that may be because of the camouflage. There is also a fairly full view of the back that shows what appear to be heat extractors on the flanks, quad exhausts at the corners, and a restrained looking rear wing. The rear hatch also looks like it might have some vents. There are a few shots of the interior but that is also camouflaged and not well defined. It is still expected that the C8 will debut as a 2020 model-year vehicle. It seems like the slow tease is finally coming to an end.
