

Museum News



The artifact of the month is Zora's (Corvette's chief engineer) racing helmet. Zora would wear this helmet during races, and later at testing sessions where he pushed the limits of his own forefront technology. He retired in 1975 but donned his helmet again on June 5, 1992. This time he wore it when he got behind the wheel of a bulldozer to ceremoniously break ground for the National Corvette Museum. He loved the thought of there being a museum to celebrate the Corvette so much that he returned again on September 2, 1994 for the grand opening of the Museum. When he passed away in 1996, he wanted his ashes to be at the Museum as well, with the cars and the people he loved. Before he passed he decided to donate the helmet, his goggles, and his racing jacket to the Museum so they could be shared with the public.

The NCM has chosen to celebrate Military Appreciation Month from May 1 through May 31, 2023. As a way of thanking those that have served or are currently serving in an branch of the U.S. military, the NCM is offering free admission during the month of May. Free admission for a military member plus one guest is redeemable at the admission counter with any valid active veteran, or retired military I.D.

To coordinate the Museum's acknowledgement of Military Appreciation Month, the NCM is planning to move their long standing Vets 'n Vettes celebration from November to May 11th-13th. This way it can be included in the nationwide celebration of the U.S. Military. It starts off with a half day at the NCM Motorsports Park. A complimentary lunch will be served to all. The Friday and Saturday celebration includes road tours and a luncheon. This event offers veterans and servicemen and women and those who want to support them, a comfortable place to meet and share stories and experiences. Misc. News



Early April brought a double dose of good news. Chevrolet reported that they would run the 2023 Corvette model year through September 1st. That was the first piece of good news. Following that, the daily production report from the 1st week in April showed that 63 Corvette Z06s were produced in one day, and a total of 194 total Corvettes were produced. That means that 1 out of 3 Corvettes produced that day was a Z06.

No one outside of GM really knows what the company's plans are for the much-rumored expansion of the Corvette lineup past its current

two-seater range. But Car and Driver Magazine, in its May 2023 issue, offers its thoughts on a the talk about a Corvette SUV. The magazine expects such a vehicle to be offered in two sizes, similar to how Porsche offers the Macan and Cayenne.

They believe the Macan competitor will have a 300-plus turbo V4 base engine, with an optional twin-turbo V6 available that would create around 400 horsepower. The larger Cayenne challenger will start out with the same twinturbo V6, but a more powerful version of the Cadillac Escalade's supercharged 682-horsepower 6.2 liter V8, along with carbon ceramic brakes and super wide tires, that could upgrade things considerably. The magazine also speculates that the first SUV will be gasoline powered and not electric, and will be built on the Alpha platform of the current Camaro and Cadillac CT4-V and CT-5 Blackwing. It is expected that the first Corvette SUV will be un-

veiled this year, with the first units arriving at dealerships in the latter part of 2024.

Chevrolet brought the 2024 Corvette E-Ray to South Florida for Barrett-Jackson's 20th Anniversary auction in Palm Beach. The E-Ray was a charity auction, with 100% of the proceeds going to "DonorsChoose" charity. The car was introduced by Corvette Executive Chief Engineer Tadge Juechter, who explained that this particular car was a preproduction model. The winner was Rick Hendrick, who bid \$1.15 million to add this VIN 001 Corvette to his collection.


