Museum News



The August artifact of the month is Dan Binks helmet. Binks was no stranger to professional auto racing. In the 1980's he was Tommy Kendall's crew chief when Kendall dominated IMSA's GTU division in a Mazda RX-7. Binks also worked on Jack Roush's NASCAR team durig the 1990's. In March 2003 it was time for a new challenge. The 12 hours of Sebring would be his first race as crew chief and tire

changer on the Corvette Racing. No. 3 car. The helmet Binks wore on that memorable day is the August artifact. Painted yellow to match the car, the famous Corvette crossed flags appear prominently on the front of the helmet. A Checkered flag pattern swoops around the sides to the back, leaving just enough room for an American flag emblem and grinning skull and crossbones above the nickname "Big Daddy." It comes complete with a set of goggles and is on loan from





Binks himself. He used the helmet through the 2008 ALMS season at Laguna Seca. He joins John Amgwert and David Wickman in the Corvette Hall of Fame Class of 2023. Binks and the No. 3 Corvette team won the race at Sebring. He remained the crew chief of the No. 3 unit until his retirement in 2020, becoming on of the most respected members of Corvette Racing. He is celebrated today for his mechanical skills and efficient pit stop coordination. His helmet is a unique piece of Corvette racing history, and a reminder of how races are often won in the pits.

There is a new event at the NCM Motorsports Park-it is the Women's HPDI event. On Saturday, October 23, 2023, the track will host its inaugural Women's High Performance Drive introduction event. It is an activity geared toward women of all skill levels. It will provide participants a fun, safe, and supportive environment for learning the fundamentals of high performance driving.

Deb Cassel gave a short recap of their day at the Altoona Corvette Club show the week before the picnic.


Allen Young recapped the Monroeville 4th of July parade.
