Update on the Sting Rays that were sent to Michigan and are sitting in a parking lot there. At least two owners who have cars parked there were able to talk to representatives from GM's Executive Resolution Board. They were able to confirm that their cars were sent there because of a problem with the dual-clutch transmission. It's still not clear if they are repairing or replacing the transmissions, but the reason for sending the cars to Michigan is that there simply was no room at the Corvette Assembly Plant for so many cars to be fixed. The fact that it is a problem with the Dual-Clutch Transmission explains why all the cars in Michigan were


Stingrays, which have a unique transmission. These transmissions for the 2024 model year were updated and feature a redesign.

Although GM won't confirm, Motor Trend has sources that indicate if the the Corvette SUV is real, then you should expect to see it in 2024. One reason is that Corvette buyers are aging and climbing into an SUV is easier than getting into a low slung coupe. It also offers more room for passengers and their stuff. The automaker does, however, recognize that a performance SUV must perform like the sports car that it sprung from.

Motor Trend also believes that after the SUV is revealed, GM will offer its first look at a concept electric Corvette before the end of 2024. The concept EV will be recognizable as a C8 but with nods to previous generations. GM will also use the opportunity to come up with a new look for the future that it hopes will appeal to a younger buyer.

Museum News



For 70 years Corvette has represented speed, style, and personal expression. It should be no surprise then that they have become a natural inspiration for Christmas decorations. This month the Museum shares 4 Corvette themed ornaments from the George Bierderman Collection.

The first ornament has Santa trading in his sleigh for a 1953 Corvette, complete with gifts. This ornament was created by ENESCO Corp. in honor of Corvette's 40th Anniver-

sary in 1993. They named it "Dream on Wheels" and was part of a larger series of ornaments. There may be other ornaments that feature Santa at the wheel, this particular orna-

ment was only sold for one year.

In 2003, during Corvettes's 50th Anniversary, Hallmark came out with another iconic ornament, the 1963 Sting-Ray split-window coupe finished in Sebring Silver.

The second ornament by Hallmark honors a toy that appeared under many Christmas trees and was released in 2008. The or-

nament celebrates Barbie's 1976 Star Vette, the first Corvette toy created for Mattel's famous fashion doll. The ornament features all of the details of the toy including the luggage







Corvette News



For the fifth time in its five year production run, the C8 has been named one of the ten best cars on sale by Car and Driver. This is the automotive equivalent of being named a first team all-star. This year, because the Z06 base MSRP exceeded the 10 best price ceiling, the honor fell back to the Stingray and the newly minted E-Ray. This marks the 25th time that the Corvette has made the prestigious 41-year old list. As the Corvette continues to propel Chevy up the record books, it sets its sights on cross-town rival Ford.

Car and Driver says that Chevrolet has delivered a new hit: the hybrid powered, all wheel drive, \$106,595 Corvette E-Ray. The 655-hp E-Ray's electrified front axle and mid-mounted 6.2 liter V-8

powertrain aren't really about green energy. The E-Ray can operate in electric only mode for very short periods at very low speeds, and only if the driver has chosen to do so before starting the car. Once the battery depletes or speed exceeds 45-mph, there's no going back to EV mode. It's all V-8 with electric assist. The E-Ray also blasts to 60 mph in 2.5 seconds, making it the quickest Corvette they have tested.

The base model still earns its own praise. For the money there isn't another production car that achieves some of its feats. Both models earned marks for comfort, livability, and their brilliant ride quality.

As part of its second annual Golden Slash Awards, the staff of The Drive has concluded that the all new Corvette E-Ray is the best performance car on sale today and their favorite to go fast. It states that the e-Ray is easily the cheapest hybrid supercar out there. It's quicker than many of them too. It's as quick to 60-mph as the McLaren P! but for less than one-tenth the price. For the \$106,595 that the E-Ray starts at you can't even get a base Porsch 911.

The Hybrid AWD Corvette beat out the off-road ready Porsche 911 Dakar, 500-pony Ford Mustang Dark Horse, and the reborn Acura Integra.


