Misc.



GM is now offering new Visible Carbon Fiber Sill plates that feature the Corvette silhouette logo and script for all three models of the Corvette, and they can be ordered on new Corvettes or through the parts department of your local Chevrolet dealer. The cost is around \$2,000.

GM has issued a new service bulletin for the 2024 Corvette Z06's automatic shift to park function which under certain rare and unique situations can fail. Apparently all it will take to correct the issue is a reprogramming of the Engine Control Module by a GM service tech. Chevy hasn't said how many cars are affected, but with the low production numbers it wouldn't seem to be too many. The repair will be available until the new vehicle limited warranty period expires for each Z06.



ACS Composite has developed another accessory for the C8, a rear window spoiler. It conceals the raw edge of the glass on the rear window while enhancing the look of the rear hatch. It has two wicker edges on the sides that matches the various C8 spoilers with wicker edges and it integrates perfectly into the Coupe's rear design. There is also a drainage system to allow any water from car washing or driving in the rain to drain through a center opening.

GM recently released 1st quarter sales figures and it shows a total of 8,576 new Corvettes were delivered during the first three months of 2024. That's an 8.5% over the same period in 2023. However, the number is lower than the number delivered in the last quarter of 2023. The plant is now building a large number of Stingrays and dealers are ordering for dealer stock so dealers should have a supply available for sale.

Museum News



The next time you visit the National Corvette Museum be sure to look up as you explore the exhibit "Driven by Design.' Suspended from the ceiling is a wire frame model in the shape of the C5 Corvette. This model was one of the tools designers used to visualize the body of the C5, the design that took the Corvette into the 21st century. When it debuted in 1997, the fifth generation was the most revolutionary Corvette ever created. Its development began in the late 1980s and early 1990s, but difficulties within GM were threatening the future of the Corvette. Sales had been falling for years and it could have been eliminated from Chevrolet's lineup. However, a dedi-

cated group of engineers remained committed to the next generation that would revitalize the Corvette name. As a result, most of the parts and pieces of the C5 were brand new components designed specifically for the Corvette. One idea was to give the C5 chassis a 'backbone' structure. This would provide better maneuverability and make the car stronger. Inspiration for the shape came from several sources including design sketches, aerodynamic testing, and even feedback from current Corvette owners. The outcome was the wire frame structure now on display, providing visitors with a peek at the creative process that gave rise to the innovative C5.



The National Corvette Museum has once again been nominated as the Best Attraction for Car Lovers in USA Today's 10 Best Competition. Voting has closed, but the results should be out in early May, so keep an eye out to see if they made it. 2024 marks the 30th Anniversary of the Museum and there will be a Corvette Caravan to the Museum this year to celebrate this milestone. 
